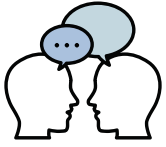

End Stigma

Build empathy and compassion by educating the public that substance dependence is a disease and reinforcing the use of patient-first language



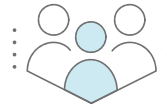
Prevention

Utilize evidence-based prevention and early intervention strategies to ensure public understanding of the dangers of substance use and where to find help if struggling



Treatment

Equitable and affordable access to evidence-based treatment, including the creation and utilization of individualized treatment plans



Recovery Support

Access to supportive environments that respect individual pathways to recovery



Medication-Assisted Treatment

Equitable and affordable access to evidence-based treatment, including the creation and utilization of individualized treatment plans



Education

Ensure equitable access to educational opportunities including community-based supports, vocational and technical programming



Harm Reduction

Increase access to harm reduction services like syringe programs, fentanyl test strips, naloxone training, and distribution



Foster Innovation

Focus on innovation, progress, equitable, sustainable solutions through collaborative partnerships and appropriate resource utilization



Housing

Increase opportunities to meet the need for supportive, safe, accountable, and affordable housing solutions for those entering and sustaining recovery



Employment

Job-readiness training for those in recovery combined with opportunities to gain stable and gainful employment to further support those in recovery



Judicial & Law Enforcement

Sustaining and expanding programs like law enforcement-assisted diversion, jail-based SUD interventions and treatment, and oversight to ensure best-practice adherence
